### **Request for Applications for Project Medical Director**

#### **About Johns Hopkins Medicine International**

Johns Hopkins Medicine International (JHI) facilitates the global expansion of the Johns Hopkins Medicine (JHM) mission: to improve the health of the community and the world by setting the standard of excellence in medical education, research and clinical care.

JHI Global Services leverages Johns Hopkins' extensive knowledge base in medicine, nursing, public health, medical education, research and health care administration to improve health care delivery. Through high-impact, mission-driven collaborations with leading health providers, governments and educational institutions around the world, JHI works hand-in-hand with the local collaborator to raise the standard of health care in a way that is customized to the local vision and the Johns Hopkins mission. One component of an affiliation between JHI and an overseas partner is designation of a Hopkins faculty member as Project Medical Director.

#### **Tokyo Midtown Medical Center (Tokyo, Japan)**

JHI has had an affiliation with Tokyo Midtown Medical Center (TMM) since 2005. TMM opened in 2007 as a state-of-the-art outpatient care center in the Tokyo Midtown Tower, a 54-story building with long-term residences, offices, a museum and a hotel. TMM was the vision of Mitsui Fudosan Co., Ltd., Japan's largest developer. Mitsui sought the expertise of JHM in planning the medical center as outpatient procedures and same-day surgeries were not widely available in Japan. TMM received Joint Commission International accreditation in 2015. Services include:

- Comprehensive executive health program
- Eye clinic
- Cosmetic and dermatology center
- Multispecialty screening center
- Specialty care clinic with full-service diagnostics including health care supplements

JHI has provided planning consulting for the development of the center including 1) Development of quality, patient safety and infection control programs, 2) Selection of major capital equipment, 3) Architectural design development, 4) Development of medical center operations and administration and 5) Technology improvement. JHI has also provided extensive support in the preparation for JCI accreditation.

JHI continues to provide services including educational observerships at Johns Hopkins Medicine, remote medical second opinion and patient referrals and development of specialty clinical programs.

## The Role of Project Medical Director

The role of Project Medical Director is a critical and contractually obligated position within JHI's overseas activities. The Medical Director serves as the medical liaison between JHI Global Services and hospitals that are managed by or are affiliates of JHI. In addition, Medical Directors serve as an ambassador and advocate on behalf of JHI and Johns Hopkins Medicine with the Partner. They are to develop positive, collaborative relations within the affiliate, and are to mentor and/or coach medical leadership counterparts. Working closely with the JHI Global Medical Director, Nursing and Clinical Quality Affairs and Project team, the responsibilities of the Project Medical Director can be grouped into four key components – 1) Clinical Quality Improvement, 2) Knowledge Transfer, 3) Clinical Program Development and Enhancement, and 4) Clinical Case Consultation.

The Project Medical Director position is compensated. Highlighted responsibilities include:

1. Co-direct the planning and development of the clinical component of the annual programmatic delivery plan with the Partner executive team and JHI project management team.
2. Co-lead clinical strategic decision making, clinical program development/enhancement and process improvement initiatives with the Partner clinical leadership.
3. Participate in monthly, at a minimum, meetings with the Partner Chief Medical Officer and other members of the executive leadership, to receive regular updates.  
Review sentinel events or other clinically urgent events with JHI Nursing and Clinical Affairs.
4. Participate with JHI staff in (at a minimum) one annual site visit and provide written reports within two weeks to document findings.
5. Attend the JHI Global Services Medical Directors Council (approximately six annually).
6. Attend the Joint Clinical Collaboration Meetings.

We are looking for faculty who are interested in extending the Hopkins mission internationally with engaged overseas partners. For this specific position, the ideal candidate will have working knowledge of ambulatory clinical operations; knowledge of Japanese is not a requirement.
