Please Note The grant is offered university-wide. In fact, we encourage cross-discipline and cross-school collaborative research. Any full-time faculty person from within Johns Hopkins University (JHU), including the schools of Medicine, Public Health, Nursing, Engineering, Business, and Arts/Sciences may act as Pl.

Program Objectives

The Fisher Center Discovery Program (FCDP) is designed to accomplish the following objectives

- To provide financial support for clinical or translational research related to environmental infectious diseases
- To provide resources for pilot or clinical studies that may lack traditional funding mechanisms
- To promote novel, cross-disciplinary collaborative clinical research
- To facilitate the research careers of early career researchers (faculty or trainees)

Eligibility

- All full-time faculty members of Johns Hopkins University, especially junior faculty, are encouraged to apply.
- Only Johns Hopkins University faculty members holding a terminal degree (MD, DO, PhD, PharmD, DVM, or equivalent) may serve as Principal Investigator (PI).
- Hopkins-affiliated postdoctoral fellows, house staff, medical school students, PhD students, graduate students, and
 undergraduate students may submit a FCDP application and be included as research team members on FCDP proposals.
 However, they may not be the PI. If the applicant is not a faculty member, the supporting Faculty member PI is required to
 write a letter indicating review and approval of the project.

Project Topics

- Emphasis will be on understudied and/or traditionally under-funded environmental infectious diseases.
- Because funding may be found from multiple sources and/or not fit within the theme of environmental infectious diseases; HIV, Hepatitis A/B/C, influenza, and tuberculosis, as examples, will not generally be considered for FCDP awards.
- FCDP resources will be concentrated on clinical research. Laboratory research will only be considered as part of a translational or clinical research project.
