PROGRAM DIRECTOR OF THE OSLER MEDICAL RESIDENCY

The Program Director of the Osler Medical Residency in the Department of Medicine will oversee all aspects of the training program. The Osler residency, founded by Sir William Osler as the first modern residency program, is recognized as a world-class program built on the traditions of bedside medicine and leadership. The Program Director will work with the Director of the Department of Medicine and the Assistant Chiefs of Service to lead the residency, will work with the Vice Chair(s) of Clinical Affairs to manage the operations of the inpatient and ambulatory teaching services, and will oversee the Associate Program Directors and Curricular Directors to manage all of the educational programming of the trainees in the residency. The Program Director will be responsible to represent the residency at the level of the health system, and nationally as a recognized leader in graduate medical education. Most importantly, the Program Director will be entrusted to preserving the values of the Osler Residency amidst a rapidly evolving landscape in academic medical centers, and to train the physicians in medicine for the world in which they will practice and lead. Specifically, the core responsibilities of the Program Director will include:

- Recruiting diverse and talented residents with the potential for future leadership in all aspects of academic medicine
- Educational programming for all residents, including Medicine Pediatrics (while on medicine) and Urban Health
- ACGME accreditation
- Operations of teaching inpatient services and outpatient clinics
- Fellowship application support, including letters of support
- Representation at JHH GMEC and APDIM
- Management of Associate Program Directors, Curriculum Directors, and Program Administrators
- Leadership of the Osler Advisory Board, including philanthropic development and alumni engagement

VICE CHAIR FOR EDUCATION

The Vice Chair for Education in the Department of Medicine will work with the Director, the Associate Vice Chair for Education, the Bayview Residency Program Director, Division Directors, and Vice Chairs to oversee and promote the educational mission for the Department. The Vice Chair will also maintain strong relationships with other entities in the Johns Hopkins community including, but not limited to, the School of Medicine and the health system. This position will maintain responsibility for finances, compliance, research and innovation for all student, trainee and faculty education in the Department. The primary goals will be to promote a culture to inspire DOM faculty and trainees to pursue educational excellence and to advise the DOM Director on all educational issues. Specifically, the responsibilities of the Vice Chair for Education, in collaboration with the Associate Vice Chair(s) of Education, will include:

- Management of the Office of Education, including Associate Vice Chairs, and Office Administration
- Continuous strategic planning process
- Medical Grand Rounds at Johns Hopkins Hospital, including Chair of the Medical Grand Rounds Committee, CME and management of the Medical Grand Rounds online library
- Oversight of and support for all directors of all training programs in the DOM, including Osler IM, Bayview IM, 14 fellowships, non-ACGME fellowships, and Health Systems Management fellowship
- Oversight and development of the Pathways programs
- Faculty development
- Medical Student experiences
- Advocacy and oversight for Diversity, Inclusion and Equity in DOM programs

APPLICATIONS

The occupant of this role will receive 50% salary support as the Director of the Osler Residency Program, up to 20% additional support as the Vice Chair for Education, and be eligible for additional bonus compensation based on milestones related to performance. Applicants should be Associate Professors or Full Professors of Medicine with requisite experience, academic success and passion for medical education to hold the Dr. Myron L. Weisfeldt Professorship in the Osler Medical Residency. Internal and external applicants are invited to apply. We anticipate a rapid selection process with interviews beginning the week of September 7 (please try to be available during that time) and to be concluded by mid-September.
