**DR. ALAN HOFMANN** is currently Professor Emeritus of Medicine at the University of California, San Diego. Dr. Hofmann is one of the seminal leaders of research in Gastroenterology and Hepatology making landmark discoveries in bile acid physiology and pharmacology. He was instrumental in establishing the research structure of the Gastroenterology Division at the Mayo Clinic, Rochester, MN and at the University of California, San Diego. A native of Baltimore, he received his undergraduate degree in 1951 and his medical degree in 1955 with honors, from the Johns Hopkins University. In 1965, he received a postgraduate degree from the University of Lund, Sweden.

Dr. Hofmann is a recipient of numerous awards including an honorary degree M.D. *ad honorem* from the University of Bologna, Italy, 1988; Fellow, Royal Society of Medicine, 1992; Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians (U.K.) 1996 and Fellow, American Association for the Advancement of Science, 1974.

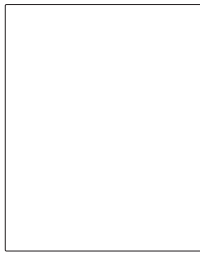
