DESCRIPTION

In Teaching Skills Part 1, participants explore concepts and incorporate skills related to teaching and facilitating learning. Concepts are presented in whole group sessions. However, most of the course time is spent in collaborative learning groups of 6-8 participants with 1-2 facilitators who stay together throughout the course. Individuals bring teaching challenges to their learning group, use reflection, dialogue, and feedback to get others' perspectives, practice the skills being learned, and observe others.

Part 2 of Teaching Skills is individualized to participant needs and is based upon their experience from Part 1. Participants continue to apply and deepen concepts and skills learned in Part 1, while addressing new content areas. As in Part 1, most of the course time is spent in collaborative learning groups of 6-8 participants with 1-2 facilitators who stay together throughout the course.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND

This activity is intended for scholarly educators in the fields of medicine, public health, nursing, psychology, and laboratory research.

OBJECTIVES AND TOPICS

After attending this activity, the participant will demonstrate the ability to describe and apply skills related to the following topics:

Part 1

- Facilitating teaching and learning.
- Promoting an effective learning environment.
- Providing concise and actionable feedback.
- Fostering small group teaching through planning and facilitation of participation and group process.
- Using active learning strategies.
- Clinical teaching and role modeling.

Part 2

- Apply skills in leadership and management, cultural humility, conflict management, formalized brainstorming, and questioning for teaching and learning.
- Working with struggling learners.
- Creating inclusive learning environments.
- Influencing learners through motivation and empowerment.
- Succeeding in academia as a scholarly educator.
